**MINUTES**

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Dave Coble called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

**II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

The minutes from the December 3, 2012 meeting were approved.

**III. CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

Erik Flodin said he was attending the meeting because of his interest in bicycling in Glendale. Steve Hancock urged Erik to apply to become a member of the Committee.

**IV. INTRODUCTIONS**

All members and guest introduced themselves.

**V. CONTINUANCE OR WITHDRAWAL OF AGENDA ITEMS**

No agenda items required continuance or withdrawal.

**VI. REPORTS FROM OTHER COMMITTEES AND ORGANIZATIONS**

Brent Ackzen said that the Citizen Transportation Oversight Commission (CTOC) would next meet on February 7<sup>th</sup>. He said that at the last CTOC meeting they discussed projections regarding city financing and revenue projection. Dave Coble reported that the Tour De Cure (for diabetes) will be on March 16<sup>th</sup> with 8-mile to 100-mile routes. He said the Bull Shifters club's website had more information on the routes and how to register for the ride.

**VII. GLENDALE FAMILY BIKE RIDE**

Steve Hancock reviewed preparations for the annual Glendale Family Bike Ride to date. He displayed the logo for the 2013 ride and the poster and registration form. Steve then displayed the route map showing the long route and short route as well as the two rest stops, one at Marshall Ranch Elementary School and one at Sunset Vista Park. Steve said that in past meetings a longer route was proposed to showcase the new bike/ped bridge over the Loop 101 freeway. Steve pointed out that this would require more directional route signs and sign stands at a cost of about \$100 per sign and at least two more police officers for traffic

control at the bridge. He went on to say that it would also add another rest stop and incur additional staff time to mark the route. Steve said that an added, longer route was not a good idea with the current fiscal situation – saying it was a time to cut costs, not increase costs. Steve added that at the next meeting in March Sandy Adams would provide more information on positions at the ride that members may choose to volunteer for.

#### **VIII. BICYCLE FRIENDLY COMMUNITIES**

Steve Hancock reported that he had completed most of the application for designation as a Bicycle Friendly Community. He said there should be no problem in finishing the application by the February 26<sup>th</sup> submittal deadline. Both Steve and Dave Coble explained the purpose for seeking this designation to new member Scott Richmond.

#### **IX. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS**

Steve Hancock suggested that members may want to get a report on future projections for city revenues and especially revenues for the Glendale Onboard Transportation Program (GO) at the May or June meetings.
