Not only will there be thirty chocolate purveyors, including local, regional and national chocolatiers, but this award-winning event includes wine-tasting, horse-drawn carriage rides, author workshops and meet-and-greets with the romance novelists, plus fabulous entertainment.

Highlights include bands such as Valley-favorite Marmalade Skies, a seven-piece Beatles tribute band performing Saturday at 3:00 p.m. and cooking demonstrations by Arizona Catering’s renowned chefs inside the Fountain Terrace of the Glendale Civic Center, on Saturday afternoon.

Visitors are invited to participate as judges in the storefront decorating contest! Simply stop by the Glendale Visitor Center to pick up a walking map with the participating businesses listed, along with the official contest ballot. Return the completed ballot to the Glendale Visitor Center by February 14 at 5 p.m. indicating your top choice for the “People’s Choice Award.” Completed ballots will be entered into a drawing to win a Cerreta’s Candy gift basket.

So much more awaits chocolate lovers at the Chocolate Affaire, including tours of Glendale’s hometown chocolatier, Cerreta’s. **City of Glendale Launching Alarm Ordinance.** The city of Glendale has now implemented an alarm ordinance similar to those in dozens of cities throughout the state. As of February 1st, FREE permit applications are available to register your security alarm with the Glendale Police Department.

Glendale’s Alarm Ordinance was created with the intent to reduce the number of false alarms throughout the city. Generating a false alarm is a violation of Glendale Ordinance Chapter 3, Alarm Ordinance. However, February 1st through March 2nd has been designated as a “grace period” to allow residents and business owners an opportunity to become familiar with the ordinance and correct any problems that may be causing false alarms.

Effective March 3, 2011 the Glendale Police Department will begin to enforce the new ordinance. A warning letter will be sent to alarm system owners after the first false alarm. Subsequent false alarms within a 365 day period will result in the assessment of fees which increase with each additional false alarm.

**Income Tax Assistance.** AARP Tax-Aide is dedicated to assisting senior citizens, low and middle income taxpayers file their personal income tax returns for FREE. Again this year, the Glendale Adult Center, 5970 W. Brown St., will be one of the sites providing this service. Tax-Aide volunteers are trained to help Arizona families with such programs as the Earned Income Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit and Education Tax Credit. Last year alone, volunteers at the Adult Center assisted about 2700 residents file returns with refunds totaling approximately \$2.6 million. No appointments are accepted and returns are done on a first-come, first-served basis. Opening day is Tuesday, Feb. 1st and runs through April 15th. Hours are: Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays - 9:00 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Thursdays - 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.; and Saturdays - 9 :00 a.m. to 11 a.m.
