

- While the Glendale Municipal Airport will remain open during the holiday, the airport's administrative offices will be closed.
- In addition, Glendale's three public libraries will be closed, as well as the Glendale Convention and Visitors Bureau.

The Glendale City Council has given direction for presentations on this topic to be conducted at public meetings with the Library Advisory Board, Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission and Arts Commission. These meetings were conducted on February 9, 11 and 12th at various locations.

The Library Services Division will compile the public input from these groups and share with the City Council. Glendale City Manager Recognized with "Outstanding Women in Business" Honor. Glendale's City Manager, Brenda Fischer, will be recognized at the 14th Annual Outstanding Women in Business event sponsored by the Phoenix Business Journal on March 30. Fischer is one of only 30 nominees who are receiving this year's prestigious award.

Fischer began her career in Glendale July 2013 and took the job as the city was facing a \$30 million deficit. In just 19 months, Fischer has strengthened the city's financial outlook by eliminating Glendale's structural deficit leading both Moody's and Standard & Poor's to improve the city's outlook from negative to stable and overseeing the refinancing of bonds to save the city in excess of \$47 million. She has also implemented a citywide organizational restructure, streamlining departments saving more than \$1 million while improving services for residents. Most recently, Fischer directed efforts for Glendale's hosting of the 2015 Super Bowl, earning the city worldwide recognition while welcoming 100,000 people on game day to Glendale's sports and entertainment district.

More than 150 nominations were received by the Phoenix Business Journal and narrowed down to just 30 by the publisher, editor-in-chief and news team. Fischer was selected as one of this year's Outstanding Women in Business for her community leadership, professional accomplishments and personal achievements.

Fischer is Glendale's first female city manager with 20 years of municipal leadership experience. She served as the city manager for the city of Maricopa and had management roles in Glendora, California, North Las Vegas and Henderson, Nevada. She is a credentialed city manager from the International City/County Management Association and a member of the Arizona City/County Management Association. Fischer's master's degree is in public administration from the University of Nevada and her bachelor's degree is in journalism/public relations with a sports information emphasis from the University of Southern California.
