Council Takes Action on Arena Management Agreement and Reservation Land

On Tuesday, the Glendale City Council approved a one year extension to its current Arena Management Agreement with the National Hockey League (NHL). The extended agreement allows for the team to remain in place for the NHL 2011-12 season; allows the NHL and staff additional time to complete the required agreement with an ownership group that will be committed to retaining the team in Glendale.

At the same meeting, the City Council approved filing an appeal with the Arizona Supreme Court in order to overturn a lower court decision that failed to acknowledge a portion of land owned by the Tohono O'dham Nation falls within the city's boundaries due to annexation proceedings dating back to 2001.



Glendale 2010 Water Quality Report. The city met all federal and state drinking water quality and environmental regulations in 2010.

The 2010 Water Quality Report is available online and is being mailed to all residents during May and June. Also known as the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), this document is required of all public and community water systems under federal law.
