Statement from the City of Glendale - July 2, 2013. On Tuesday, July 2, the Glendale City Council voted to approve an arena management agreement that keeps the National Hockey League's (NHL) Coyotes playing at the city-owned Jobing.com Arena in Glendale. The agreement allows for IceArizona Acquisition, a company owned by Renaissance Sports & Entertainment Group (RSE), to use and manage the arena as the new owner of the Coyotes team.

The arena in Glendale has been home to the Coyotes for the last 10 years and the new agreement allows for the team to continue playing in the city, keeps current arena revenues intact and provides new revenue for the city. As the anchor tenant for Jobing.com Arena, the Coyotes NHL schedule includes more than 40 home games that annually attract more than 500,000 fans. Activity from these games generates sales tax revenue at the arena, as well as from numerous surrounding restaurants, hotels and retail shops.

Since 2009, when the previous owner of the team unexpectedly filed for bankruptcy, the city has worked diligently with the NHL to find a solution that protects Glendale's investment in the sports and entertainment district and keeps the team in

our city. The vote by the Glendale City Council brings a resolution to this issue and is welcome news to Westgate businesses and hockey fans who attended the council meeting to voice their support for the decision. The city looks forward to the 2013-2014 hockey season where the NHL's Coyotes will continue to play in their home at Jobing.com Arena in Glendale.

New Glendale City Manager. The Glendale City Council has officially approved the appointment of Brenda Fischer to the city's top executive position of city manager.

Since 2011, Fischer has managed the city of Maricopa and has worked in city government in Arizona, Nevada and California for the past 18 years. Highlights from her management background include public administration, public finance, human resources, intergovernmental relations, economic development, strategic planning, labor relations and public information.

"This is an absolute honor and amazing opportunity to be selected for this position in the city of Glendale," said Fischer. "I'm looking forward to leading the city and working with the mayor, council, city staff, residents and businesses to carry out the council's vision and continue to make Glendale one of the leading communities in the Valley and the state."

Under Fischer's leadership, she oversaw the entire business plan for the city of Maricopa to construct a new city hall, police station, two fire stations, 120 acre regional park and a 52,000 square foot multi-generational and aquatic center. She also implemented Maricopa's first-ever mid-year budget forecast, the city's first business incubator program and zoning code updates to enhance economic development.

"We look forward to working with Ms. Fischer and believe she will bring new leadership for a new era in Glendale." Said Vice Mayor Yvonne Knaack.

Prior to joining the city of Maricopa, Fischer was a Deputy City Manager in Glendora, California and spent 15 years in management positions in southern Nevada working for the cities of Henderson and North Las Vegas. Fischer is a credentialed city manager from the International City/County Management Association (ICMA) and a member of the Arizona City/County Management Association. She has a master's degree in public administration from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas and a bachelor's in journalism/public relations with a sports information emphasis from the University of Southern California. Fischer becomes Glendale's first female city manager and the only currently-seated female city manager of the major cities in the Valley. She competed with more than 40 other candidates to earn the top position in Glendale. She will officially begin work with Glendale on July 22.
