Glendale Citizen's Police Academy Alumni to Present \$15,000 Donation to Department. The Citizen's Police Academy Alumni of Glendale (CPAAG) will present a check to the Glendale Police Department for \$14,987.78 as a donation to assist the department in building an agility course for police K9s. The donation is the result of months of fundraising efforts by CPAAG members.

The check will be presented to the Glendale Police Department in a ceremony to be held at 4 p.m., August 5 at the Glendale Police Department's Main Station, 6835 N. 57th Drive in Glendale. The presentation will be held in the main classroom.

CPAAG is a 501c3 organization comprised of residents who have completed the Glendale Police Department's eleven week Citizen's Academy. These dedicated citizens support the Glendale Police Department through volunteerism and fundraising efforts for special projects. Glendale City Council Supports Trust Land for Gaming. On Tuesday, July 15 the Glendale City Council voted in favor of repealing the Council's 2009 position that opposed the Tohono O'odham Nation developing land within Glendale's planning area for a proposed casino and resort. The vote repeals the 2009 position and states that the city officially supports the trust land being utilized for gaming.

The Glendale City Clerk will send a copy of today's resolution to all members of the Arizona Federal Delegation, announcing the city's position.
