Glendale Seeks High School Students to Serve on Mayor's Youth Advisory Commission. Mayor Jerry Weiers is seeking new members for the Mayor's Youth Advisory Commission (MYAC). Several vacancies have been created as a result of former MYAC members graduating from high school this past spring.

MYAC provides high school students with opportunities to make a positive impact in Glendale by getting involved in their local city government and community. Youth commission members volunteer for community service activities, raise funds for projects and serve as a liaison to the mayor as the foremost voice on local youth-related issues.

Commission members must commit approximately five hours per month to attend meetings and participate in activities. Standing commission meetings are held each month at Glendale City Hall.

To be eligible for the competitive selection process, teens must reside in Glendale and be enrolled in high school for the 2014-15 school year, as well as submit a completed membership application.

According to the February 2014 AARP bulletin, "Roughly one-third of all scam victims are 65 or older, though the age group comprises only one-eighth of the population. Based on reports, victims who are 55 and up lose \$3 billion a year, but the true figure is many times higher, because most of these crimes go unreported out of embarrassment."

The [AARP](http://www.aarp.org) Fraud Watch Network can help you fight back with resources like watchdog alerts and a scam-tracking map that will help you outsmart con artists before they strike. The presenter will discuss the most common scams used by con artists, behaviors that put people at risk and tips to protect targeted populations from fraudulent schemes.
