

### JANUARY

- **Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.** The Fiesta Bowl hosted the Ohio State University Buckeyes and the University of Texas Longhorns. 2009 marked the Fiesta Bowl's third year in Glendale.

## MARCH

- **Camelback Ranch-Glendale.** The state-of-the art spring training facility, Camelback Ranch-Glendale, hosted its first spring training season for the Chicago White Sox and the Los Angeles Dodgers.

## MAY

- **"Click it or Ticket" Grant.** The Governor's Office of Highway Safety (GOHS) awarded the Glendale Police Department a \$10,000.00 grant for seat belt and child restraint violations enforcement.

## JUNE

- **Shop Glendale 2009-10.** Glendale launched *Shop Glendale 2009-10!* The important tax dollars generated by making purchases in Glendale help fill library shelves with new books, replace the playground equipment at local parks and ensure that streetlights are always on.
- **Centennial Countdown.** Glendale kicked off its centennial year with a Centennial Concert & Old-fashioned Carnival in Murphy Park on June 18.
- **From the Heart.** Glendale's [From The Heart Program](#) distributed \$224,500 to social service agencies.
- **2009 Spark Awards Recognize Residents.** Glendale recognized neighborhood leaders, community volunteers and businesses that have contributed to their community and improved the quality of the city's neighborhoods with [Spark Awards](#) at the Neighborhood Leadership Forum, on Saturday, June 27.

## JULY

- **Deputy HUD Secretary in Glendale.** Deputy HUD Secretary Ron Simms visited Glendale and toured Glendale's Public Housing that was modernized with recovery act funds.
- **Special Art Honor.** The Circles of Time by Howard Meehan, the Myrtle Avenue entryway at Grand Avenue, was one of 40 artworks selected for the "2009 Year in Review Award" at the annual Americans for the Arts Convention. [Read more.](#)

## AUGUST

- **Fire Station 151.** Fire Station 151 opened in its new location, 6851 N. 52nd Avenue, just south of Glendale Avenue. This station replaced Glendale's oldest active station, which opened in 1969.
- **Pet Food Drive.** Glendale's Building Safety department hosted a pet food drive through the month of August to help homeless pets in the West Valley.
- **Police Department Re-Accredited.** On August 1, a board from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA) awarded re-accreditation to Chief Conrad of the [Glendale Police Department](#).
- **Performing Arts.** The Glendale Arts Commission awarded performing arts contracted services to non-profit organizations, schools and government agencies for the FY 2009/10. The Arts Commission recommended funding 11 performing arts projects totaling \$35,500.

## SEPTEMBER

- **AARP Award.** The city of Glendale was named by AARP to its 2009 list of *Best Employers for Workers Over 50*. The City joined an impressive list of 50 honorees around the country and is the only city organization nationwide that has made the list.
- **Western Area Regional Park.** A ribbon cutting ceremony was held to open the new ramada complex at the city's [western area regional park](#). This park project includes many exciting family-friendly features that will provide fun opportunities for residents of all ages.

## OCTOBER

- **Parks and Recreation Accreditation.** The [Glendale Parks and Recreation Department](#) became the 80th agency in the country and internationally to have earned the national agency accreditation from the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA).
- **City Court Receives Domestic Violence Grant.** Glendale City Court and the Glendale Domestic Violence Taskforce received a \$400,000 grant from the Department of Justice. The award represents the third consecutive Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) grant the Court and Taskforce have received.
- **Luke Forward Campaign.** The city of Glendale, along with other government and business leaders kicked off a statewide campaign on October 14, at the Arizona Capitol to bring the new F-35 joint strike fighter to Luke Air Force Base. [Click here](#) to register your support.
- **Domestic Violence Training Summit.** The Glendale City Court and Police Department held a Statewide DV Training Summit at the Glendale Civic Center on October 6<sup>th</sup>. Nationally-recognized speakers and local/state experts presented topics to state-wide domestic violence professionals.

## NOVEMBER

- **Capitol Christmas Tree Visit.** The first-ever capitol Christmas tree from Arizona stopped in Glendale on its journey to Washington, D.C.
- **Best of the West Awards.** The Glendale Parks & Recreation Department won a WESTMARC Best of the West Award for the Grand Canal Linear Park and Trail located between 75th Avenue and Camelback Road, and State Route 101 and Bethany Home Road.
- **Glendale Glitters.** Glendale Glitters Spectacular in 2009 was unlike any other. As part of the city's centennial activities, two 100-years-young residents helped to turn on the Glendale Glitters holiday light display on November 27. [Read more.](#)
