

Cactus District Neighborhood Improvement Grants Update

Cavalier Dale Neighborhood – The Grant for design of new sidewalks on Ocotillo between 51st and 50th avenues was completed January of '08. The neighborhood applied for, and was granted funds for the construction of the project on March 25 by the City Council. The funding was received in late September. The project is currently in the bidding process for construction services.

Maryland Heights II – Contracts are being prepared for the design of various internal street drainage enhancements for the neighborhood located north of Maryland Avenue to McLellan Road between 45th to 46th avenues. This grant was awarded in the fall of 2008.

Sands West Neighborhood – Contracts are being prepared for upgrades to Mission Park. New amenities include a shade structure and picnic table. This grant was awarded in the fall of 2008.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Service Day Project. Volunteer groups are needed to pick citrus at Sahuaro Ranch Park Historical area for use in food boxes on Saturday, January 17. This project will benefit St. Mary's Food Bank Alliance. The vitamin-rich citrus will be distributed to families in need.

Glendale PD to Warn On License Frames for 30 Days. The Glendale Police Department has elected to issue only warnings for the first 30 days regarding the new law about the proper display of license plates. They will also use the 30 days to educate the motoring public about the new law when drivers are stopped for other reasons.

As of January 1st, ARS 28-2354 was revised to include a provision that the word "Arizona" not be obscured on Arizona license plates. Many after-market license plate frames do, in fact, cover the word Arizona, and would cause the driver to receive a ticket.
