

These volunteer citizen advisory groups research, study and discuss specific Glendale projects and issues and then forward their recommendations to the City Council. Councilmember Phil Lieberman Appointed to National Committees. Councilmember Lieberman has been reappointed to serve on three policy and advocacy steering committees for the National League of Cities (NLC).

He will begin his 10th term on the University Communities Council Steering Committee, which assists cities, state municipal leagues and the NLC in gathering, sharing and analyzing information about opportunities, issues and policies of interest to university communities.

He will continue to serve on the Human Development Steering Committee. The committee develops policies on employment and job training, early childhood development, temporary assistance to needy families, unemployment insurance, income support programs, immigration and refugee policy, health and education, equal opportunity and social services.

Lieberman will also begin his 14th term on the Leadership Training Council, which provides overall guidance and direction to the NLC's Leadership Training Institute.

The NLC, which is the largest national organization representing municipal governments in the U.S., serves as a resource to and an advocate for the more than 19,000 cities, villages and towns it represents. Its mission is to strengthen and promote municipalities as centers of opportunity, leadership and governance.

Glendale Putting Stimulus Funding To Good Use. Glendale has received more than \$11 million in federal stimulus funding in the areas of public safety, community services, energy efficiency and conservation and transportation, which has and continues to provide services, resources and savings to the city and its residents. With these funds, the city has been able to move forward with several community-based projects that would have otherwise not been possible. Especially noteworthy are the projects listed under the Energy Efficiency and Conservation grant, which are estimated to result in a savings of more than \$497,000 in annual operating and maintenance costs, a substantial advantage for the city's general fund. Furthermore, because Glendale was able to make these energy efficiency upgrades through the grant, the city is applying for rebates from Arizona Public Service (APS) and Salt River Project (SRP.) If the rebates are received, they must be reinvested into other energy efficiency projects such as additional lighting retrofits and other energy saving projects.

Ruth served on the Historic Preservation Commission and is past president of the Glendale Arizona Historical Society.

The Historic Preservation Commission will evaluate the nominations and select the award recipient. The award will be presented during the month of May, which is National Historic Preservation Month.
