**Spring 2013 Household Hazardous Waste Schedule.** Glendale's Household Hazardous Waste Collection provides a safe way to dispose of unwanted hazardous waste. Call the Sanitation Division between February 25 and March 22 at 623-930-2660 to make your appointment for pick-up. The collections will be handled March 18 through April 5.

There is a 20-gallon limit on paint, oil, gasoline, antifreeze and other automotive liquids. No single container may be larger than 5 gallons. All items should be in their original containers and must be clearly marked to identify their contents. **Glendale Citizen Police Academy.** The Glendale Police Department is accepting applications for the upcoming Citizen Police Academy which begins on Wednesday, March 13, 2013. The application deadline of March 1st is quickly approaching!

The Citizen Academy is a free program designed to offer participants the opportunity to learn, hands on, about many Glendale Police Operations, such as the use of Police Canines, Crime Scene Investigations and Tactical Operations. The curriculum also includes an overview of the Glendale Police Department's Administration, Police Communications, and Community Oriented Policing.

Participants must be at least 18 years of age and undergo a background check and fingerprinting process. All fingerprinting and completed applications must be submitted no later than Friday, March 1, 2013. The Citizen Police Academy is 11 weeks in length and is held on Wednesday nights from 6 to 9 p.m. at the Glendale Regional Public Safety Training Center and Glendale Police Main Station. There will also be one Saturday class.
