### **Social Service Agencies Invited to From The Heart Grant Application Workshop.**

Representatives from social service agencies that serve Glendale residents are invited to a workshop on Wednesday, February 29 to learn how to apply for *From The Heart* grant funds.

The workshop will be held at 2 p.m. in room B-3 at Glendale City Hall, 5850 W. Glendale Ave. Grant applications will be available at the workshop. Applications can also be downloaded online. To do so, [click here](#) then click "Documents" on the left side of the page.

In order to be considered for funding, social service agencies must be non-profit 501c3 organizations that serve Glendale residents. Agencies must also be operational for at least two years prior to applying for grant funds, which range from \$2,500 to \$20,000.

The deadline to submit a completed application packet is 4 p.m. Friday, March 16.

From The Heart's mission is to promote the positive development of youth, strengthen the capabilities of families and assist residents in addressing crisis needs. The program is a partnership with Glendale residents and businesses, the Gila River Indian Community and city of Glendale. Funds are raised through the generosity of residents, who add \$1 to their monthly city utility bill payments, and through corporate donations.

The Glendale Arts Commission awards support up to \$4,000 per applicant in the fields of theater, dance and music. To be considered for this program the applicant must reside in, or work in partnership with, an organization domiciled within the city limits of Glendale. **Glendale Celebrates Sweet Success With Downtown Festival Season.** Glendale is attracting large numbers of visitors to its downtown due to the city's series of winter events, including Glendale Glitters, December holiday weekends, Glitter & Glow and the Glendale Chocolate Affaire. Thus far, the festivals have brought approximately 400,000 attendees to the area.

Last year, Glendale's entire season totaled about 400,000, meaning this season will certainly surpass that number, with the upcoming Jazz & Blues Festival adding to attendance overall. The city's series of Glitters-related festivities drew approximately 275,000 – an increase over 2010-11. Opening weekend attendance was 80,000; Spirit of Giving Weekend was 25,000; Winter Wonderland Weekend was 30,000; Jingle Bell Rockin' Nights was 40,000; and Glendale Glitter & Glow drew 100,000 in a single night!
