MWU Dental Students to Offer Free Dental Care to Kids at March Event. On Saturday, March 23, Midwestern University's College of Dental Medicine-Arizona will host Give Kids a Smile, a student-organized and faculty-supervised community event which offers free dental care for local kids and education for their families. Give Kids a Smile is supported by the Arizona Dental Foundation (ADF).

Give Kids a Smile will take place from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Midwestern University Dental Institute at 19369 N. 59th Avenue in Glendale. Approximately 400 children ages 6 to 17 will have the opportunity to receive free screenings and treatments including cleanings, sealants, fillings, or extractions. Families will also be able to receive important information on proper oral health maintenance and disease prevention. Spanish-speaking faculty, staff, and students will be available.
