

Traffic Restriction at 59th and Northern Avenues. A traffic restriction at the intersection of 59th and Northern avenues began this week for the replacement of a Southwest Gas pipe.

During construction of the North side of the intersection, traffic on Northern Ave. will be reduced to a single lane in both directions approaching the intersection and traffic on 59th Ave. will be reduced to a single lane heading south and two lanes heading north.

The contractor will be working between approximately 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., but traffic barricades will remain up 24 hours a day. An off-duty police officer will control the intersection signal lights during construction hours.

The first half of the project is scheduled to be complete by April 30, then work on the south half of Northern Avenue will begin. The project is estimated to be completed by May 20.

Shred It & Forget It. The thought of someone stealing something tangible from you is frightening. The thought of someone stealing your identity can be even more so. The fact is, should someone steal your identity, its after-effects can haunt you for years to come. It's truly devastating. Often times, the victims of identity theft don't even know their personal information has been compromised until it's too late. There are a variety of ways you can protect yourself:

- Do not disclose personal information to strangers via the Internet, telephone, applications or through the mail unless you initiated the contact.
- Order a copy of your credit report from each of the three credit bureaus once a year.
- Install firewall and anti-virus software on all your computers.
- Never leave outgoing mail in your mailbox, especially with checks enclosed.
- Pay attention to your bank and credit card statements and examine the activity for unauthorized charges.
- Limit the items you carry with you, for example don't carry your Social Security card.
