

27th Annual Glendale Jazz & Blues Festival-This Weekend! The 27th Annual Glendale Jazz & Blues Festival will feature a tremendous lineup of local, regional and national entertainment in Historic Downtown Glendale April 17-18. Again this year, Glendale's longest-running festival will feature an eclectic mix of artisans representing myriad art forms. Four artists will work on-site, giving event attendees an interactive, one-of-a-kind experience to add to the musical performances.

The Glendale Jazz & Blues Festival will also feature craft artisans, and delicious food and beverages, including wine tasting by Kokopelli Winery.

The event will run noon to 10 p.m. on Saturday, April 17 and noon to 6 p.m. on Sunday, April 18. Admission and parking are free. Glendale Police to Host Shred Event. The Glendale Police Department is teaming up with the Target Corporation Saturday, April 17, 2010 for the city's "Shred It and Forget It" event. This free "drive-thru" event is designed to promote public awareness about identity theft and fraud prevention. According to the Federal Trade Commission, identity theft impacts at least 9 million people each year. Shredding documents, instead of throwing them in the garbage, is an essential tool in combating identity theft.

Community members are invited to bring their unwanted personal documents to be shredded securely on site, free of charge. Law Enforcement staff will be on hand to assist residents with the shredding of up to three boxes (banker-size) of personal documents at no charge from 9 a.m. until noon (or until the trucks get full) at the Target Store located at 10404 North 43rd Avenue.

Crime Prevention Specialists from the Glendale Police Department will be available to answer questions throughout the event. Event participation is on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information, call (623) 930-2571.

Parks and Recreation Master Plan Update Workshop. The City of Glendale is in the process of preparing an update to the existing Parks and Recreation Master Plan. The last plan was adopted in February 2002, and since that time many changes have occurred within the community and surrounding areas.

As a first step, the public is invited to attend a meeting on April 29. Those attending will have an opportunity to learn about the parks and recreation system and provide feedback. The preliminary goals and objectives, results of an analysis of the existing conditions and other background information will be presented for review and comment.

Glendale Seeks Input on Fair Housing Concerns. As a recipient of federal funds, Glendale works with our non-profit partners to educate and address identified fair housing issues in the city. Glendale announces a new survey called the “Analysis of Impediments Study” that is available on-line.

The city encourages the public to provide input on any impediments or any barriers that are experienced, which could affect their rights to fair housing choice. Impediments to fair housing choice are defined as any actions, omissions, or decisions that restrict, or have the effect of restricting, the availability of housing choices, based on race, color, religion, sex, disability, familial status, or national origin.

Glendale is committed to fair housing practices and wants to ensure it is doing all that it can to eliminate barriers to fair housing.
