

The official launch of Travel Green is scheduled to take place at the Glendale Garden Festival tomorrow (Saturday, May 3) from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Glendale Xeriscape Demonstration Garden, located at the Glendale Main Library, 5959 W. Brown Street. Staff from Glendale's Transportation Department will have a booth set up at the festival to provide Travel Green hand-out information and giveaway items.
