**Glendale Community Band.** Glendale’s favorite summer tradition is back for its 46th season beginning June 7 in downtown Glendale.

The eight-week concert series takes place each Thursday at 8 p.m. June 7 through July 26, in the Murphy Park Amphitheater, located at 59th Avenue and Glenn Drive. Music lovers of all ages will be entertained by this community band of approximately 100 musicians with its renditions of marches, ballads and show tunes.

The Glendale Summer Band, conducted by John Faris, is the longest-running community band in Arizona. The ages of the volunteer band members span several generations. The band was formed in 1966, originally playing at O’Neil Park, and moving to Murphy Park when the amphitheater was built.

These free concerts are the perfect night out for the entire family, or bring your friends, neighbors, the whole gang! Bring lawn chairs or blankets for seating. Food, snacks and refreshments will be available for purchase at the concerts. The series will feature a special Patriotic performance on June 28 in celebration of Independence Day.

**Aquatics Centers Open June 2.** It’s hot out there and Glendale’s pools are getting ready to cool you off this summer beginning June 2. With features like slides, lap pools, diving areas, aquatic playground, zero entry pools, and most important, cool and refreshing water, it’s like an ultimate water park experience. The Rose Lane Aquatics Center, 5003 W. Marlette Ave., will be open every day from 1-5 p.m.

Entrance fees for Glendale residents are \$2.50 for ages 3-17, \$5 for adults and \$3 for adults 55 and older. Non-resident rates are \$3.50 for ages 3-17, \$6 for adults and \$5 for adults 55 and older. Ages 2 and under are admitted for free. Swim passes offering reduced rates on the entrance fees are available and provide 15 entrances valid for the entire summer. The passes for Glendale residents are \$33 for ages 3-17, \$70 for adults and \$40 for ages 55 and older. The passes for non-residents are \$49 for ages 3-17, \$86 for adults and \$71 for ages 55 and older. The passes can also be used at Foothills Recreation and Aquatics Center.

Both pools also offer swim lessons and lap swimming. Southwest Ambulance has provided a \$5,000 grant to offer free swim lessons to children. For more information on all the aquatics programs, [click here](#).

**Dignity Health to Build Medical Campus in Glendale –Grand Opening Slated for Early 2014.** Dignity Health, the parent organization of Chandler Regional Medical Center, Mercy Gilbert Medical Center and St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center has announced plans to develop a 35-acre medical campus in Glendale.

The campus will become the centerpiece of Dignity Health's recent West Valley expansion. It will be anchored by a 60,000 square-foot hospital that is expected to open in early 2014. An initial \$44 million investment for the campus will include construction of an emergency department, a 24-bed inpatient hospital with two operating rooms, and dedicated space for diagnostic services. It expects to employ about 200 people. The hospital also has the capacity to expand to 200 inpatient beds as demand grows.

The medical campus and hospital will feature new approaches to healthcare via its onsite collaboration with Dignity Health partners. Dignity Health has vigorously built business relationships with non-profits and healthcare businesses in order to provide the best and most financially efficient options for patients.

The medical campus, located near the Loop 101 and Glendale Avenue, will begin with construction of the emergency hospital, followed by the development of additional outpatient services and a medical office building. [Click here](#) for more information.

The award is named after Ruth Byrne, a long-time Glendale resident, who has worked tirelessly for many decades to support and further the preservation of Glendale's history.

Since his retirement from the city of Glendale in 2010, Ron has emerged as an influential advocate for historic preservation in the private sector. In his current role as Vice President of the Glendale Arizona Historical Society, Ron has been an instrumental part of a very dedicated group of people who educate and promote Glendale's heritage.
