

Click it or Ticket Update. On Wednesday May 26th, 2010 the West Valley GOHS Click It or Ticket Task Force conducted a day long saturation of west Olive Avenue through the following agencies' jurisdictions: Phoenix, Glendale, Peoria, El Mirage, Surprise, and MCSO.
