

Maricopa County Animal Care & Control Vaccination Clinic

Maricopa County Animal Care & Control (MCACC) wants to take some of the strain off keeping your pets healthy. MCACC's "Uno por Uno" program will hold FREE Rabies Vaccination Clinics for dogs and cats on June 9th and 27th. The clinics will be held from 4-6 p.m., at the MCACC West Shelter, 2500 S. 27th Ave.

Dogs must be on a leash less than 6 feet in length and cats must be in carriers.

MCACC offers canine 4-in-1 vaccines for \$23 and Feline 3-in-1 vaccines for \$27 at the clinics as well. What's more, your pet will receive a basic wellness exam with the purchase of one of these vaccines. Clinics are held rain or shine; however, MCACC reserves the right to cancel or limit the clinic duration in the event of severe weather.

Glendale 11 Video Provides Information for Customers Seeking CAP Assistance. Glendale residents seeking assistance with rent, mortgage and utility bills can now watch an informational video providing an introduction to and important requirements for Glendale's Community Action Program (CAP).

The 14-minute video, produced by Glendale 11, provides an in-depth look at the qualifications, procedures and the documentation required by applicants seeking assistance. Knowing the documentation, which must be provided at the time of appointment, is necessary for those needing assistance to complete their applications. The documentation includes photo identification, Social Security cards, birth certificates and utility bills.

The video helps to educate the public on the detailed state requirements for CAP assistance. The video also explains the rules and regulations for those applicants residing in government housing, receiving child support, social security benefits or veteran's assistance benefits.

The last five minutes of the video provide answers to frequently asked questions such as: "Who is eligible?" "How do I apply for services?" and "How do I obtain missing documents?"

The video is being played continuously in the CAP office lobby to provide its message directly to CAP's customers.
