

Update on Purchase of NHL Coyotes. At the Tuesday, June 8 meeting, the Glendale City Council voted unanimously to approve a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) from Ice Edge Holdings to purchase the National Hockey League's (NHL) Coyotes team and keep the team playing in the Glendale-owned Jobing.com Arena. The approved MOU will now be forwarded to the NHL for a final decision.

The proposal keeps the city's commitment of forwarding potential owners to the NHL by the deadline of June 30. Glendale remains committed to ensuring the citizens' and stakeholders' best interests are at the forefront of any negotiations. [Click here](#) for more details.

Thunderbird Tower Restoration Fundraising Effort. A fundraising campaign to raise money for the restoration of one of Glendale's most historic and significant landmarks – Thunderbird Tower — recently kicked off.

The tower served as the airfield control tower at Thunderbird Field, a historic airbase opened by the U.S. Army Air Corps in 1941 to provide training for American, British, Canadian and Chinese pilots. By the end of World War II, more than 10,000 pilots passed through Thunderbird Field.

At the kick-off event on June 3, Mayor Scruggs announced M&I Bank as the campaign's honorary co-chair for business development and Glendale residents Ray and Winnie Kultala as the honorary co-chairs for resident development.
