

Firefighters Remind Folks to be "Heat Safe." Glendale Firefighters are advising the public to think "heat safety" heading into a week with expected temperatures of about 110 degrees. The Arizona summer heat can be deadly and should NOT be underestimated. Following these Glendale Fire Department Safety Tips will add to the safety of you and your family:

- Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of fluids and limit beverages such as soda and those containing caffeine and alcohol. These types of beverages can cause dehydration.
- Use sunscreen.
- Exercise should take place indoors or as early in the morning as possible.
- Cover your head. Wear a hat to provide shade.
- NEVER LEAVE CHILDREN OR PETS INSIDE OF AN UNATTENDED VEHICLE.
- WATCH YOUR CHILDREN AROUND WATER.

Around Town

Glendale Avenue Project.

As part of the city's pavement management program, Glendale Avenue from 51st to 66th avenues will be improved with new rubberized asphalt this summer. The process uses recycled tires and is expected to extend the life of the roadway, reducing maintenance costs and decreasing traffic noise. Below are some of the benefits of rubberized asphalt:

- Reduces reflective cracking in asphalt
- Reduces maintenance costs
- Improves resistance to cracking in new pavements
- Improves resistance to rutting in new pavements
- Increases pavement life
- Improves skid resistance
- Decreases noise levels
- Uses 500-2,000 scrap tires per lane mile

Construction began in late June and will end by early September. Much of the construction work will take place at night and message boards will be in place to alert drivers to traffic restrictions.

During construction, the public is encouraged to follow all traffic signage and instructions from public safety officers directing traffic. [Read more](#) about city improvements.
