City Of Glendale Posts Draft Document of Formal Agreement on West Valley Resort Project. The city of Glendale has posted a document on the city website of a draft agreement between the city and the Tohono O’odham Nation’s proposed West Valley Resort project. The draft document can be viewed at www.glendaleaz.com.

The Glendale City Council will consider the proposed agreement next Tuesday, August 12 at 6 p.m. in the Council Chambers at 5850 W. Glendale. The meeting can also be viewed online via the city TV station, Glendale 11, at www.glendaleaz.com/Glendale11 or on Cox Channel 11 for Glendale residents.

Glendale Police Awarded \$20,000 Occupant Protection Enforcement Grant from the Governor’s Office of Highway Safety. In an effort to save more lives and reduce the number of injuries related to vehicular collisions on Arizona’s roadways, the Governor’s Office of Highway Safety is partnering with the Glendale Police Department and other local law enforcement agencies to increase the proper use of seat belts and child safety seats.

Although Arizona has a secondary seat belt law, the enforcement campaign is based upon high visibility traffic enforcement with a “zero-tolerance” approach towards seat belt and child safety seat usage. It will also include an educational component to the encounters with violators.

This funding will allow the Glendale Police Department to deploy extra traffic enforcement resources in school zones, as well as the areas surrounding the schools, during the month of August as students around the valley go back to school.

Glendale Public Schools open their doors this week! It is important to pay attention while driving for the safety of other motorists and pedestrians as well as taking the time to properly secure children before driving them to school. To ensure the safety of the children and parents, the Glendale Police Department will actively enforce traffic laws around school zones, buses and crosswalks.

Despite widespread efforts to educate drivers about effective ways to protect people and reduce fatalities, motor vehicle collisions continue to be the leading cause of death and serious injuries to the citizens of our state. Regular seat belt use is the single most effective way to protect people and reduce fatalities in motor vehicle crashes.

Funding was provided from the Governor’s Office of Highway Safety in partnership with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and is designed to increase and sustain the seatbelt usage throughout Arizona.

Seat belts do save lives, so please BUCKLE UP!
