

Important Traffic and Parking Information for Upcoming Cardinals Season. Football fans need to be aware of changes in the parking plan for 2012, in order to receive the best fan experience possible in the city's Sports & Entertainment District this season.

As in past years, season ticket holders have received parking passes from the Arizona Cardinals with specific parking and traffic instructions. Maps to the assigned parking lots are printed on the back side of parking passes. However, fans should pay special attention to the newly designated parking lots and color-coded sections in and around Westgate City Center. The new colors and the appropriate access points are:

- Purple - access via Glendale Avenue, south on 95th Avenue
- Blue – access via Glendale Avenue, south on 93rd Avenue
- Yellow – access via Glendale Avenue, south on 91st Avenue

Here is additional information that fans need to be aware of this season:

- Pedestrian walkways will be different than in years past. Use sidewalks and crosswalks to ensure the safety of drivers and pedestrians.
- Game day cash parking is available at Westgate City Center and the Renaissance Hotel parking garage. Drivers should access this parking via Glendale Avenue and then south on 95th or 93rd Avenues.
- Parking for single game ticket holders is at the Kellis High School lot, located on the east side of 91st Avenue just north of Orangewood Avenue. A free shuttle service will run between the high school and the stadium beginning two hours before game time and ending one hour following the game.
- Parking lots open four hours prior to kick-off. Vehicles will not be permitted to stage on city streets prior to the lots opening.

The new parking maps are available on the city's website for both fans as well as taxi and limo drivers. Visit www.glendalesgotgame.com to download them.

The city of Glendale has partnered with ADOT to provide real-time traffic information, and fans are encouraged to call **511** for updated traffic information. In addition, updates are available via Twitter at www.twitter.com/GlendaleTraffic.

Glendale Police will be directing traffic to establish a safe and steady traffic flow. Multiple electronic messaging signs will also be in place to direct traffic.

Animal Defense League of Arizona. The Spay Neuter Hotline, a program of the Animal Defense League of Arizona (ADLA) has exciting news! It's trap-neuter-return (TNR) program for free-roaming, primarily feral, cats, has received funding from two sources to TNR cats in zip codes 85301 and 85302. The project will not only benefit the cats by reducing the population and preventing unwanted litters of kittens born on the streets, but it will also benefit the community. Sterilizing feral cats reduces offensive behaviors that divide many neighborhoods.

To participate, caregivers must agree to sterilize all the cats and have them released back to where they live. ADLA will provide traps and an appointment at one of several participating veterinary clinics. Trapping and transportation assistance will be made available to those in need.
