

Last Thursday **Councilmember Lieberman** received the [Local Elected Officials Distinguished Service Award](#) for 16 years of service and dedication to strong, effective local government in Arizona. The presentation was made at the annual Arizona League of Cities and Towns conference.

New City Courthouse. On August 26, the City Council awarded a design-build contract to D.L. Withers Construction for the design and construction of the new City Courthouse. The new enhanced court building will allow the city to continue meeting the needs of Glendale residents and provide better customer service. The redevelopment of this property will also spur economic development in the area. The new courthouse will be located at 4705 W. Glendale Ave., and is scheduled to be in service by March 2010.

Storm Ready. After hurricane-force winds plowed through the valley last night, Glendale residents can be assured that our emergency management officials are continuously working to ensure our community is ready for whatever type of emergency comes our way. In fact, Glendale was recently named as a StormReady community by the National Weather Service (NWS.)

StormReady is a nationwide community preparedness program, sponsored by the NWS that recognizes communities who develop plans to handle all types of severe weather, from wind storms to extreme heat, as well as alert and educate citizens of potentially hazardous weather conditions.

Certain standards must be met in order to be recognized as a StormReady community. These include 24-hour warning points, such as weather radios, and an emergency operations center to monitor and receive severe weather forecasts and warnings; a system for disseminating information to alert the public of hazardous weather conditions; community programs to promote public readiness; and a formal hazardous weather plan, which includes trained severe weather spotters.

Glendale is one of only eight cities in Arizona and one of only 584 cities/communities nationwide to be designated StormReady. For information about how to make sure your family or business is ready for an emergency, visit www.glendaleaz.com/emergencymanagement.

Annual Grant Application Orientation. Glendale's Community Revitalization Division will conduct a grant application orientation session that will address key elements of the 2009-10 funding cycle. All non-profit and governmental agencies interested in applying for grant funds are encouraged to attend the workshop session, beginning at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 9, at the Glendale Council Chambers building, 5850 W. Glendale Ave., in room B3 (basement level). The session will cover grants administration, application preparation and construction-related information.

The city of Glendale uses an on-line application system, which is designed to streamline the time and paperwork necessary to apply for grants. Attendees at the orientation program will be able to see a demonstration of the on-line system. Projects and programs that are grant-funded must benefit the residents of Glendale.
