

New Dust Control Requirements Effective October 1, 2009. Beginning in October, property owners are prohibited from allowing parking, maneuvering, or use of an entry/exit area greater than or equal to 3,000 sq. ft. in size unless the surface is permanently maintained with a dustproof method. The requirement is effective Oct. 1, 2009 for all residential buildings. For commercial, industrial, and residential buildings with more than four residential units, the requirement was effective Oct. 1, 2008. New Products for Visually Impaired at the Library. Glendale Public Library has new software on the public computers that will help the visually impaired in two ways. It will enlarge the text, as well as read it aloud.

The new products provide screen magnification up to 36 times over the original, and can change screen colors to eliminate glare and reduce eyestrain. The user can change the size and color of the mouse pointer and text cursor, making them easier to find and follow. Multi-lingual speech synthesizers have natural-sounding speech. The products are easy to use and can be accessed from all the library's public computers.
