

Community Housing Division Earns ‘High Performer’ Status. The city of Glendale’s Community Housing Program recently received notice it has been rated a “high performer” for the 16th consecutive year by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the city’s administration of HUD’s Section Eight Housing Choice Voucher Program.

Glendale’s Community Housing Program assists 4,340 individuals – nearly half of them children under the age of 18 – in its Section Eight program and works with 840 landlords across the city.
