

**Glendale Glitters Spectacular, November 27-28.** Glendale Glitters kicks off this weekend, November 27-28 from 5-10 p.m. each evening in historic downtown Glendale. Free admission and free parking mean you can bring the whole family and not break the bank!

The exciting stage show counts down to the lighting ceremony on Friday evening, November 27 beginning at 5:30 p.m. The stunning display of 1.5 million lights will illuminate twelve blocks of Historic Downtown Glendale, making it the largest free holiday light display in Arizona. Visitors of all ages will delight in holiday entertainment, delectable food, hand-crafted holiday gifts, a children's winter wonderland, horse-drawn carriage rides, shopping and, of course, visits with Jolly Ol' St. Nick.

This year's Glendale Glitters Spectacular will be unlike any other, because the city is celebrating its 100th anniversary. As part of the city's centennial activities this year, two 100-years-young residents will be joining the Glendale City Council on Friday, November 27, to help turn on the Glendale Glitters holiday light display for the first time this season. The two centenarians will be part of a 30-minute lighting program called, "Celebrating Glendale's Centennial," which will highlight the city's first 100 years through music, dance and other entertainment.

Event attendees are encouraged to use the free shuttle to downtown Glendale, from Glendale Community College, 6000 W. Olive Ave. Please note that the shuttle runs from the north campus lots, and cars should enter off of 59th Avenue, north of Olive. The shuttle will run continuously from 4-10:30 p.m.

**Coyotes and Glendale Celebrate Centennial.** The city of Glendale is turning 100 and the Coyotes are joining in the fun by hosting hundreds of students for Flat Murphy Glendale Centennial Night, Thursday, Dec. 3, at the Phoenix Coyotes/Calgary Flames game. The game begins at 7:30 p.m. at Jobing.com Arena.

Flat Murphy is based on the popular children's character Flat Stanley, but with a twist. The city's version is a gingerbread man who is named 'Murphy' after W. J. Murphy, Glendale's founder.
