Christmas and New Year's Glendale Holiday Notices. City of Glendale offices will be closed for the upcoming holidays: half day on Monday, Dec. 24 (closes at noon) and all day Tuesday, Dec. 25 for the Christmas holiday, as well as Tuesday, Jan. 1 in observance of the New Year's holiday. Treecycling Sites. Glendale residents are encouraged to recycle their live Christmas trees by dropping them off at the following sites. The "treecycling" sites will be open from Wednesday, Dec. 26 to Sunday, Jan. 13.

- Acoma Park, 53rd Avenue and Acoma Road
- Fire Station #156, 67th Avenue and Deer Valley Road
- Foothills Park, 57th Avenue and Union Hills Drive
- O'Neil Park, 64th and Missouri avenues
- Rose Lane Park, 51st and Marlette avenues
- Sahuaro Ranch Park, southeast corner of 63rd Avenue and Mountain View Road
- Western Area Regional Park, 83rd Avenue and Bethany Home Road

Trees must be unbagged, and all decorations, tree stands and metal stakes must be removed. Trees collected at the recycling stations will be used for composting and mulch. For more information, call 623-930-2660.

Free Electronics Recycling at the Glendale Landfill. Out with the old and in with the new. This is the time of year when many electronic items are purchased, and people get rid of their old TVs, DVD players, cell phones and more. Just in time for these holiday purchases, Glendale is now providing residents a permanent drop-off location for electronics recycling. The electronics recycling (E-Waste) program offers a convenient way to recycle unwanted electronic items safely and responsibly.

The E-Waste drop-off area is located at the Glendale Landfill. Residents can bring both working and non-working electronic items to the landfill anytime during regular operating hours, and the program is free of charge. Not only is the program free for residents, it is no charge to the city to have these items recycled.

The types of electronic items that will be accepted are:

- Computer equipment, including personal computers, laptop and notebook computers, central processing units (CPU's), keyboards, monitors, circuit boards, hard drives, other computer drives (floppy, CD-ROM, Zip, etc.), software, printers, copiers, scanners, fax machines, external storage devices and modems
- Other office equipment, including typewriters, calculators, adding machines, telephones and answering machines
- Other miscellaneous and home electronics, including cell phones, pagers, televisions, (console, flat screen, projection, etc.), videocassette recorders (VCRs), stereo equipment, speakers, cameras, radios and video game systems

While this is a new addition to the city's recycling program, E-waste items should NOT be placed into the residential curbside containers.

The Glendale Landfill is located at 11480 W. Glendale Ave. Hours of operation are 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday and closed on Sunday.

Since only 300 skaters are allowed access on the ice at once, there will be four skate sessions available (2-3, 3:15-4:15, 4:30-5:30 and 5:45-6:45 p.m.) Concession stands and the Coyotes Den team store will also be open throughout the day.
