8/6 and 8/20/2013	Weiers and Chavira	Improve Western Area Regional Park - SW corner of Glendale Regional Heroes Park and develop cost estimates for construction and O&M for the soccer fields	Mayor Weiers (8/16 and 8/20) and CM Chavira (8/6 and 8/20) requested staff develop cost estimates on soccer fields, greening up of a section of the Glendale Regional Heroes Park and an archery range. Mayor Weiers and CM Chavira intend to use the information with potential donors to see if outside funding can pay for construction. Mayor Weiers and CM Chavira brought item up at workshop on 8/20/2013.	Scheduled for 3/18 workshop	Erik Strunk	This item was discussed at workshop on 10/15. Council requested staff work with the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission to conduct community outreach, assess interest and need, and identify potential partners for an archery range only - at no cost to the City. Staff reviewed a draft outreach strategy with the P&R Commission in October and again in December. A community open house will occur on January 22, 2014, 6:00 p.m. at the Heroes Park XCourt Building and a demonstration project is set for January 25, 2014, 11 a.m. on site. Area notification will be mailed out the first week of January 2014 and the P&R Commission will be briefed in February 2014.

VM Knaack would like a meeting with TO and all parties involved with a impartial facilitator. On 1/7, CM Alvarez requested the city make a decision on the casino issue and is requesting the city vote on it. CM Alvarez does not want any more money spent on legal fees. Conduct an assessment of potential costs to the city's fire, police, transportation and other impacted departments.

Scheduled for 3/4 workshop	Stuart Kent	Meetings have been held with impacted departments. Jamsheed Mehta will prepare a summary of departmental input regarding this issue. Scheduled for 11/5 workshop. Consensus was received to bring this item to a future voting meeting for Council consideration. Guidelines for private use of city property are being prepared. A license agreement for motorcycle training on the Brown lot will follow, and will be taken to Council if the terms of the agreement are acceptable to the applicant. Stuart Kent and Jamsheed Mehta will prepare Guidelines for Private Use of City Property and a Licensing Process that will cover all city-owned vacant property. The Motorcycle Training School's request will be subject to the process that will be presented to Council in March.
