CM Sherwood stated this would send a strong message on discrimination and show goodwill especially with the upcoming Super Bowl. CM Sherwood also inquired about a Human Resources ordinance and Human Resources Commission. At the December 2 workshop, CM Sherwood requested agenda item #3 (Discussion of Non-Discrimination Ordinance and Human Relations Commission) be brought back to a future workshop.	Pending	Jim Brown, Nancy Mangone and Brian Friedman	Staff presented at Dec. 2nd workshop. Human Resources will begin implementation of administrative changes. Council consensus was given to proceed with Attachment D, Unity Pledge. Item will be considered for Council approval by resolution at the December 18 voting meeting. This item will be brought back to a future workshop to discuss consideration of a non-discrimination ordinance. Staff presented at the January 6 workshop. Council consensus was received to begin public input with the assistance of a facilitator. The city has received 3 proposals from potential facilitators and will meet as an internal team to review proposals. Follow up meetings will be held with potential facilitators prior to selection. Once that selection has been made, the city will begin working with the facilitator to obtain feedback and recommendations to plan/program the public outreach effort per Council direction. Council gave direction to proceed with implementing the scenic corridor from 51st Avenue to Union Hills along the Loop 101. This will be done through a Zoning Text Amendment defining the Loop 101 as a scenic corridor and amending the Arrowhead Ranch Specific Plan. This will be done simultaneously and will take 9 to 12 months to complete.
