Pending future workshop	Jon Froke and Sam McAllen	Staff members have reviewed existing city codes and regulations related to short term rental of residentially zoned properties; currently there is no restriction concerning the length of occupancy related to residential properties. Additional research has been conducted to determine if/how other cities may be addressing similar situations within their jurisdiction. The staff team will be meeting with the City Attorney's Office to review possible implications associated with a possible Zoning Ordinance interpretation or with a change to our Zoning Ordinance. Staff will provide an update on research associated with short term rental homes, often know as vacation rental homes, in residential neighborhoods at a future workshop. The Zoning Ordinance does not define long term and short term residential.
