CM Sherwood also inquired about a Human Resources ordinance and Human Resources Commission. At the December 2 workshop, CM Sherwood requested agenda item #3 (Discussion of Non-Discrimination Ordinance and Human Relations Commission) be brought back to a future workshop.</p>	Pending future workshop presentation	Jennifer Campbell and Karen Kurtz (outside facilitator)	<p>Presented at Dec. 2nd workshop. HR began implementation of administrative changes. Council consensus to proceed with Attachment D, Unity Pledge. Item will be considered for Council by resolution at December 18 voting meeting.
