She is stepping into the role following Jean Moreno's retirement from the city of Glendale after 30 years of service.

In this role, Hall will manage the strategic planning, policy development, community funding, and community engagement efforts to enhance services for Glendale citizens. She will lead a staff of over 110 persons who manage programs including neighborhood revitalization, community housing, community action program, and library services.

"I am committed to strengthening the community by providing critical services that focus on education, infrastructure, housing, and crisis support to expand access to economic opportunities for the entire community."
