CITY OF GLENDALE NAMES NEW ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPUTY DIRECTOR

Trent Dutry is appointed to lead multiple divisions driving citizen engagement

GLENDALE, Ariz. – The city of Glendale is excited to welcome Trent Dutry as the new Economic Development Deputy Director. Dutry has decades of experience in project and community management and will lead the teams responsible for city events and arts and culture engagement.

In this role, Dutry will manage the Special Events Division, the Arts and Culture Division, and redevelopment efforts including Downtown Development. The position directs city events like Glendale Glitters, the music festival Live! and Ballet Under the Stars. Additionally, Dutry will supervise permits for all events happening citywide.
