#### INTRODUCTION

The City of Glendale's yearly Annual Action Plan (AAP) details the funding strategy for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG), and HOME Investment Partnerships Program each year. This Annual Action Plan implements our jurisdiction's Five-Year Consolidated Plan and is developed through significant public input, analyses, and planning. This document is a Substantial Amendment to the City of Glendale's Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Annual Action Plan, which was submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on June 29, 2018.

Title 24 Section 91.505 of the Code of Federal Regulations stipulates that participating jurisdictions shall amend their approved plans whenever they make one of the following decisions:

- 1. To make a change in its allocation priorities or a change in the method of distribution of funds;
- 2. To carry out an activity, using funds from any program covered by the Consolidated Plan (including program income) not previously described in the action plan; or
- 3. To change the purpose, scope, location, or beneficiaries of an activity.

The Regulation further requires that jurisdictions identify in their citizen participation plans the criteria they will use for determining what constitutes a substantial amendment.

The City is part of the Maricopa HOME Consortium and is party to the Consortium's FY 2015-19 Citizen Participation Plan. Consistent with these requirements, the City identifies three criteria that will require a substantial amendment:

- 1. Changes in the use of CDBG/ESG funds from one eligible activity to another;
- 2. An activity is undertaken that was not previously included in the Consolidated Plan or subsequent action plans.
- 3. More than twenty percent of the most recent annual federal grant allocation is reallocated to other eligible program activities within the fiscal year.

The proposed substantial amendment is a change in the use of CDBG funds from one eligible activity to another, including a new activity not previously included in the FY 2018-19 AAP, and meets one of these three criteria. Therefore, this qualifies as a substantial amendment.

#### SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT

The City is amending the FY 2018-2019 Annual Action Plan to include The O'Neil Park Redevelopment Project as a new CDBG physical improvement activity, identified prior year CDBG project savings, and reallocated FY 2018-19 funding from one or more projects to another to carry out this activity.

#### **PUBLIC NOTICE**

Notice is hereby given that the City of Glendale, Arizona proposes to amend its Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-19 Year Four Annual Action Plan, under the 2015-2019 Five-Year Consolidated Plan. This Substantial Amendment proposed by the City of Glendale, Community Services Department, Community Revitalization Division, will including the following adjustments to the allocation of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds:

- Reduce the FY 2018-19 CDBG funding allocated to the City of Glendale Parks and Recreation Park ADA Improvements activity from \$160,000 to \$37,000 (a \$123,000 reduction)
- Reduce the FY 2018-19 CDBG funding for the Residential Rehabilitation Program City Administered activity from \$886,883 to \$735,120 (a \$151,763 reduction)
- Reduce the FY 2016/17 CDBG funding for the City of Glendale Parks and Recreation Renovation/Revitalization of Community & Recreation Centers activity from \$117,612 to \$57,612 (a \$60,000 reduction)
- Add an activity called the City of Glendale Parks and Recreation O'Neil Park activity and increase the CDBG funding from \$-0- to \$334,763. This proposed CDBG physical improvement is an eligible activity under the CDBG National Objectives. This project will result in more recreational opportunity to low to moderate income residents in the proposed project area.

This Substantial Amendment will be available for a 30-day public comment period from Thursday, September 27, 2018, to Monday, October 29, 2018, at 5:00 PM. All residents, property owners, persons with disabilities, immigrants, seniors, low-income, children and youth, homeless persons,

#### SUMMARY:

The City of Glendale's FY 2018-19 Annual Action Plan, the fourth year of the 2015-2019 Five Year Consolidated Plan, requires that this proposed change undergo a Substantial Amendment process. The Substantial Amendment must allow for public participation and a comment period of 30 days. The City of Glendale is proposing to reallocate CDBG physical improvement funds in the amount of \$334,763 to a new eligible CDBG activity, O'Neil Park Redevelopment Project.
