COUNCILMEMBER TALKS FIREWORKS & WATER SAFETY WITH GLENDALE FIRE DEPARTMENT ON GLENDALE 11 TV

Glendale, Ariz. — Cholla District Councilmember, Manny Martinez features the Glendale Fire Department on his upcoming edition of the TV show, Glendale Today. Martinez highlights two current and critical topics: fireworks and drowning prevention.

During the half-hour TV show, Martinez interviews the city's assistant fire marshal, Larry Randall, about the city ordinance prohibiting the use of consumer fireworks in Glendale. Randall explains the background and the reason for the ban and also explains why fireworks are for sale, but banned from all use in Glendale.

Martinez's other guest, Glendale Fire Public Information Officer, Michael Young, discusses the timely topic of water safety, especially during the hot summer months. The interview teaches viewers about the "ABC's" of water safety: adult supervision, barriers and CPR. Information on local CPR classes and swim lessons is also provided.
