COMMUNITY MEETING SCHEDULED FOR 59TH AVENUE PROJECT

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Residents are invited to a community meeting from 6 to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 1 to review project plans on street improvements for 59th Ave. from Deer Valley (Melinda Lane) to Pinnacle Peak Road.

The open house will be held in the Roadrunner Room at the Foothills Library, located at 19055 N. 57th Ave.


During the open house, residents will be able to view plans and drawings for the alternate alignment proposed by the “Save the Park” group during the public comment process, and approved by Council earlier this year.

Representatives from the city and engineering consultants will be available to answer questions about the design.

The two-lane design of the new roadway will feature a paved shoulder that will provide separation between the travel lane and the bike lane, as well as provide an area for emergency stops and to enable police officers to conduct traffic enforcement. A landscaped median will be constructed and feature native desert-type plants. Construction is planned to begin in August 2006 with a completion date in mid-2007.
