TWO NEW CLASSES AVAILABLE FOR GLENDALE RESIDENTS

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Glendale residents have an opportunity to participate in one or both of two new classes the city is offering: “Learn What Occurs at Court Outside the Courtroom” and “Disaster Preparedness.”

Learn What Occurs at Court Outside the Courtroom:

City Court tries criminal and civil traffic violations, as well as non-traffic criminal misdemeanor cases. Some of the cases the court handles include driving under the influence, drag racing, child restraint violations and assault. This two-day class will focus on learning the Domestic Violence laws in the State of Arizona and how DUI criminal cases are processed. The first night will also cover the roles of the prosecutor, defense attorney, judge and jury. The second night will be interactive where the students participate in a mock trial.

The class will be held from 5:30-7:30 p.m., Tuesday and Wednesday, Nov. 29 and 30 at the Glendale City Court complex, 5711 W. Glendale Ave. Parking is available along 57 Avenue and in a public parking lot located south of the court building. Students should leave all non-essential items at homes as everyone will pass through security screening prior to entering the court room.
