PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE FOR DOWNTOWN PEDESTRIAN PROJECT

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Historic Downtown Glendale is getting a makeover- complete with improved sidewalks, lighting, seating benches, bike racks and landscaping.

Residents are invited to a public open house to learn more about the project Monday, August 28 from 6 to 8 p.m. at Landmark Middle School cafeteria, located at 5730 W. Myrtle Ave.

City of Glendale representatives and project engineers will be available to answer questions and gather public input.

The goal of the downtown pedestrian enhancement project is to improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists, as well as revitalize historic Downtown Glendale.

In addition, artists will design two entryways, welcoming visitors into the downtown area.

The design process started in February 2006 and the plan is expected to be complete by October 2006. Construction will start in February 2007 and is scheduled for completion in November 2007.
