PRIMARY ELECTION SET FOR SEPTEMBER 12


GLENDALE, Ariz. – Every vote counts and this year city of Glendale voters will cast their votes in a fall election. Registered voters will soon receive a publicity pamphlet with voting information on the city's upcoming primary election, which will be held September 12, 2006.

On September 12, Glendale voters will decide “yes” or “no” on Propositions 402, raising the Mayor's annual salary from \$35,000 to \$48,000 and Proposition 403, raising the City Councilmember's annual salary from \$17,500 to \$34,000. Cholla, Barrel and Ocotillo District voters will select District Councilmembers.

Before receiving a ballot at the Maricopa County polling place on election day, every voter is required to show proof of identity. This new requirement is a result of Proposition 200, the statewide initiative approved by voters in 2004. All identification must match the voter's name and address shown on the Maricopa County elections signature roster.
