In addition to the survey, Glendale’s Community Revitalization Division will be hosting a series of public meetings to inform the public about the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI) survey which is a review to identify problems associated with people in protected classes being able to choose a place to live within their financial means.
