## **Veterans Honored at 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Glendale Memorial Ceremony** *Citizens Invited to Join Tribute to Veterans*

**Glendale, Ariz.** — The Glendale Veterans Memorial Association and the Glendale Library and Arts Division cordially invite you to attend the 12<sup>th</sup> annual Veterans Day Ceremony on Tuesday, Nov. 11, at 10:00 a.m. at the Glendale Veterans Memorial on the front lawn of the Glendale Main Library, 5959 W. Brown St.

During this ceremony in honor of Arizona's service men and women, members of the Glendale Veterans Memorial Association, the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and Disabled American Veterans will replace the current flags from the memorial with new ones. These flags include an American flag, an Arizona state flag, and a POW/MIA flag.

Ret. Master Sgt. Wayne Crusinberry, who has been instrumental in the creation and continued success of this ceremony, notes that the Mayor, members of the City Council, Fire Department, Police, and other city officials have been invited to attend. A similar ceremony, sponsored by the Disabled American Veterans, takes place every July 4.

Commissioned by the Glendale Public Art Program with major funding through the city's 1percent for Art Fund, artist Joe Tyler's memorial is officially titled "For Every Drop of Blood—For Every Life Devoted." Here are all the details about the [memorial](#).
