SuperParenting Your Child

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Just what does “superparenting” mean?

William Maxwell, Ph.D., presents “SuperParenting: Developing the Genius in Your Child” at 7 p.m. on June 19 in the large meeting room of Glendale Main Library, 5959 W. Brown St.

In his third library appearance, Dr. Maxwell will discuss how every culture has discovered some secret for successful child rearing. He believes that is remains for the culture not yet born to teach all cultures how to manifest the ancient prophecy that every child is designed to be a genius.

He offers a few examples of lessons learned through other cultures:

- The Scots in the early 1600s invented the after-dinner “Family Hour,” where the family sat together, read something inspiring, discussed the reading, played some music and games, and simply bonded. Consequently, the Scots are given primary credit for inventing the Industrial Revolution which followed that revolution in family education.
- The Fijians, with the lowest mental disease rate in the world, invented the 21-day rule that the newborn must never leave a woman’s arms so as to give the newborn great emotional security. The mother’s female relatives customarily move in to assist.
- The Samoans in the Pacific and the Hausas in Nigeria invented two different kinds of fathering strategies so that every child is

guaranteed the guidance of a mature male. Without emotionally stable father-figures, children predictably are headed for disastrous life-styles.

- The Koreans established probably the world's healthiest natural food diet for pregnant and nursing women, thus guaranteeing the typical Korean child an enormous brain formation advantage over children whose mothers are under stress and who are not aware of proper pre-natal precautions.
- The birthing stool is mentioned in the Bible, which, in effect, endorses births with the mother in a vertical position, which opens her birth canal 28 percent wider than women who give birth in a prone position. Such babies have far less incidence of brain damage.
- In the 1920s the Russians and French re-invented "natural childbirth," thus teaching the medical professions how to prevent many disabilities often associated with childbirth; these include dyslexia and cerebral palsy.

Dr. Maxwell, who earned his master's and doctorate degrees at Harvard University, and his late wife, Mary, a registered nurse, lived a combined total of nearly 50 years in over 50 nations on all continents. They learned some of the most important secrets of successful child rearing abroad. He will share their findings with the audience. His book, "SuperParenting: Child Rearing for the New Millennium," will be for sale following the presentation.
