GLENDALE, Ariz. – Glendale Mayor Elaine Scruggs is looking for high school students to serve on her youth commission for the 2011-12 school year.

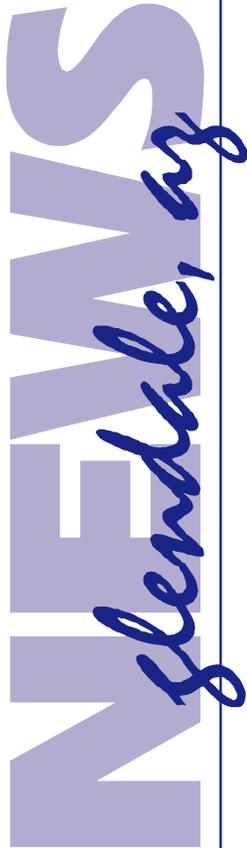
The Mayor's Youth Advisory Commission (MYAC) provides students with opportunities to make a positive impact in Glendale by getting involved in their local city government and participating in community service projects.

In addition to planning and organizing community service projects, commission members produce and host their own television show called *Teens Today*. The ½-hour program, which airs on Glendale 11 – the city's cable channel – focuses on the positive contributions teens make in the community.

MYAC members must commit approximately five hours per month to attend mandatory meetings and activities. Commission meetings are held from 7 – 8 p.m. on the fourth Thursday of each month at Glendale City Hall.

To be eligible, teens must submit a completed membership application, reside in Glendale and be enrolled in high school for the 2011-12 school year. Membership is limited to 50 students.
