Expert advice and project consulting is available from city staff. Groups loaned tools will be responsible for returning all borrowed items in the condition in which they were checked out. Tools are available on a first-come, first-served basis. In addition to the tools-on-loan, a limited amount of funding is available to cover additional items that may be needed.

The type of equipment available from the Tool Shed includes:


- Painting supplies
