**RECYCLE YOUR ELECTRONICS AT GLENDALE'S  
E-WASTE EVENT SATURDAY, NOV. 13**

**GLENDALE, Ariz.** – Too often yesterday's gee-whiz electronics become today's landfill clutter. In the city of Glendale, it doesn't have to be that way. Now it's easy to recycle out-of-date electronics – from phones to TVs – at the second annual e-waste event from 8 to 1 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 13 on the campus of Glendale Community College (GCC).


The event is being held in partnership with the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, Westech Recyclers and GCC. At last year's event, 29,000 pounds of potential electronic waste was collected for recycle.

Many old electronics' parts can be recycled and used in manufacturing new and refurbished electronic products. "We all know how fast electronics change," said Glendale's Field Operations Director Stuart Kent. "We want to help people embrace new technology by giving residents an environmentally responsible way of disposing of their unwanted computers, phones, TVs and other electronics."

The public is encouraged to bring their outdated, unwanted or even non-working electronics to this year's event at Glendale Community College, 6000 W. Olive Ave, Glendale. The e-waste event will accept any type of electronics for recycling such as computers, phones, household appliances, cabling and batteries.
