GLENDALE COUNCILMEMBER HUGH HIGHLIGHTS GLENDALE YOUTH PROJECT ON GLENDALE TODAY

Glendale, Ariz. — Glendale Councilmember Ian Hugh’s new edition of the TV show “Glendale Today” features an overview and tour of the Glendale Youth Project (GYP), a program that offer sports and activities for kids and teens. Hugh interviews project coordinators Carlos and Lina Meza about the group’s mission to give kids the chance to experience sports, along with mentoring for career exploration, life skill development, sports and tutoring.

Participants in the various GYP programs share how important having a place to go and do positive things is to them and the impact it has on the community.

Established in 2011, Glendale Youth Project targets youth from 6-17 years old who have been identified as at-risk for becoming involved in a negative peer group. The GYP partnered with the city of Glendale and moved to the Glendale Community Center where free sports and programs are offered to youth and teens.

The 30-minute TV show, produced by the staff at the city’s TV station, Glendale 11, will air Friday, Oct. 11 at 8 p.m. and will then air daily on Glendale 11 as well as online via the city’s video library at www.glendaleaz.com/video.
