IMPORTANT TRAFFIC INFORMATION FOR UPCOMING PRESEASON CARDINALS GAMES

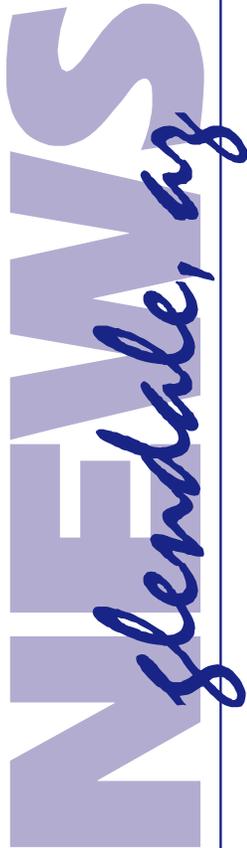
GLENDALE, Ariz. – Football fans are gearing up to cheer on their Cardinals, and as the preseason gets underway, the city of Glendale wants to remind fans and drivers in and around the Sports and Entertainment District of suggested routes and important traffic information that will help make everyone's experience go smoothly.

Season ticket holders have received parking passes from the Arizona Cardinals with specific parking and traffic instructions. Maps to the assigned parking lots are printed on the back side of parking passes.

Here is information that fans need to be aware of for this season:

- Cash parking is available at the Glendale Renaissance Parking Garage and at Westgate City Center. Drivers can access this parking via Glendale Avenue and then south on either 93rd Avenue or 95th Avenue.
- Public Parking is also available at Kellis High School, located on the east side of 91st Avenue between Northern and Glendale avenues. A free shuttle service will run between the high school and the stadium beginning two hours before game time and ending one hour following the game.
- Parking lots open four hours prior to kick-off. Vehicles will not be permitted to stage on City streets prior to the lots opening.

“Fans should plan to arrive early and follow the route on the back of their parking pass,” said Glendale Principal Traffic Engineer Debbie Albert. “Fans can access parking maps on www.glendalesgotgame.com. The heaviest traffic typically occurs on the Loop 101 and there is currently construction to add HOV lanes to Loop 101; therefore, fans should allow themselves extra time and may consider alternate routes to the stadium such as using surface streets to gain access to the area.”

For the safety of pedestrians, 95th Avenue west of the stadium and Maryland Avenue between 93rd and 95th avenues will be closed to vehicle traffic.

The city of Glendale has partnered with ADOT to provide real-time traffic information, and fans are encouraged to call **511** for updated traffic information.

In addition, Glendale has a Twitter page designed to keep drivers in the know with up-to-the-minute traffic updates. The page, www.twitter.com/GlendaleTraffic, will be updated by Glendale Police Department and Glendale Transportation Department representatives who are monitoring traffic flow during the football games.
