CITY ANNOUNCES TWO NEW CLASSES FOR GRADUATES OF GLENDALE UNIVERSITY

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Registration is now available for two continuing education opportunities for Glendale residents who have previously graduated from the 101 class of Glendale University. These two new graduate courses have not been offered in the past.

Connecting the Community through Parks and Recreation

The Glendale Parks and Recreation Department will present a two-part course about managing the parks program and facilities. Both of the sessions will be held at the Glendale Adult Center, 5970 W. Brown St., in room 102.

The first section, entitled “Connecting the Community through Planning and Capital Improvement Projects,” will be held Monday, Sept. 24, from 6-8 p.m.. The class will discuss how the community plays a major role in the prioritization and development of parks, green space, trails and facilities. In addition, an overview of the planning processes and the latest updates on projects will be shared with the class.

The second section, “A Day in the Life of Parks and Recreation in Glendale” is scheduled for Monday, Oct. 1, from 6 to 8 p.m.. The class will learn about the maintenance of the city’s 2,100 acres of open space and trails and the many programs offered for all ages.
