Between 10 and 11 a.m., the Glendale Water Services Department – Conservation and Sustainable Living Division will provide a free presentation about how this educational garden has evolved over the past 25 years. From 11 a.m. to noon, participate in a walking tour to learn about desert-adapted plants, landscape design and sustainable landscape practices.
